The average salary of the man who left school when a boy of 14 or younger is from \$600 to \$200 a

school and does not begin work un-til he is 18, has worked 22 years whom he arrives at the age of 40 and has carned \$24,200. The difference between \$24,200 and \$20,800 is \$3800. This repre-ments the cash received for the four years agent in high school. At the

The difference between \$14,100 and \$29,800 is \$3400. This represents the coah received for the four years ejemt in high school. At nine mouths to the year this amounts to about \$55 a mouth for the time actually apens in high school graduate. But look from another point of view. The high school graduate carus an average of \$100 a year; the eighth grade graduate an average of \$300 a year. The difference is \$300 a year. Now it would take \$6000 at 5 per cent interest to yield an in can income of \$300 per year.

A high school course is as valuable then from a purely financial standpoint as \$6000 invested at 5 per cent.

HOW TO KILL FLIES QUICKLY AND CHEAPLY

Professor R. L. Smith, entomologist. North Carolina agricultural station, says: "Formula is a very successful potson for files in spits of many re-ports to the contrary. I have recently used it extensively with excellent re-sults. The method that I have found

used it extensively with excellent remils. The method that I have found
most successful is the use of formaliin milk with the following preportions.
"One onnee (two rabbespoonfuls) of
formalin; sixteen onnees (one pint) of
equal parts milk and water.

"In this proportion the mixture seems
to attract the tiles much better than
when used in averdened water. The
mixture should be exposed in shallow
plates. A pice of bread in the middle
of the plate formistics more space for
the fless to might and freed and in this
way serves to attract a greater number of them.

"I first used this pulson in a milk
room where the files were very numemas and polsomed over 5,000 tiles in




