

## DOES HIGH SCHOOL PAY IN DOLLARS?

FACTS AND FIGURES ON HIGHER  
EDUCATION.

Average Salary of Man Who Leaves  
School at 14 Is About \$700 While  
the Average Annual Salary of the  
High School Graduate Exceeds a  
Thousand Dollars.

During the summer vacation, when a great many boys and girls are engaged in the hard work of the home, farm, mine, factory or shop, the thoughts of the youthful workers often turn to the vocations that bring a greater return of money with work of a more pleasant nature. The natural ambition of the boy or girl to better his or her condition is often restrained by the fact that to do so one must necessarily give up working for wages long enough to go to school. This, of course, works a hardship in many cases, but when the ultimate benefits are taken into consideration the matter of foregoing pleasures and enduring hardship for a few years while one is attending high school are of but small import.

A few people will contend that the one who stays with the salary or wage and does not get a high school education will be ahead in money of the boy or girl that stops work and goes to high school. A glance at the following figures will show that such an idea is wrong.

There is little difficulty attached to getting a high school education

at present. Fine public schools are maintained within easy reach of all and there seems to be no good reason why anyone should fail to get the best preparation one can have for their life's work.

The courses offered in our own high school cover a wide range of up-to-date, practical subjects and when its doors open on September 24 there should be between two and three hundred of the boys and girls of Eastern Utah there to take advantage of the fine opportunities offered.

### Does It Pay?

Does a boy or girl profit in dollars and cents by attending high school?

Mr. G. W. Swartz, superintendent of Continuation School of Gary, Ind., has prepared the following figures:

Here are the average earnings per week of the boy who leaves school at 14 and does not go on to high school:

His total earnings from the time he is 14 until he is 28 amount to about \$5700.00.

Here are the average earnings per week of the boy who remains in school and completes the high school course at 18:

His total earnings from the time he is 14 until he is 28 amount to about \$7350.00.

The difference between the earnings of the two is \$1650.00. By the time he is 28 years old the boy who stayed in school has received \$150.00 for every year he spent in

## HOW TO KILL FLIES QUICKLY AND CHEAPLY

Professor R. L. Smith, entomologist, North Carolina agricultural station, says: "Formalin is a very successful poison for flies in spite of many reports to the contrary. I have recently used it extensively with excellent results. The method that I have found most successful is the use of formalin in milk with the following proportions: 'One ounce (two tablespoonfuls) of formalin; sixteen ounces (one pint) of equal parts milk and water.

"In this proportion the mixture seems to attract the flies much better than when used in sweetened water. The mixture should be exposed in shallow plates. A piece of bread in the middle of the plate furnishes more space for the flies to alight and feed and in this way serves to attract a greater number of them.

"I first used this poison in a milk room where the flies were very numerous and poisoned over 5,000 flies in less than twenty-four hours on several occasions. Over a pint of flies were swept up in this room each time the poison was used.

"Another experiment was used in a large calf barn where the flies were numerous. I exposed six ordinary school plates of the formalin poison mixture and killed about 40,000 (four quarts of flies) between 12 o'clock noon and 3 the next morning. This is only an illustration of what can be done with formalin around stables where flies are breeding. I could cite a number of cases where the formalin poison mixture has been used in unscrubbed kitchens and dining rooms and resulted in killing practically all the flies.

"A good place to use this formalin is on the front and back porches, where flies are frequently numerous and waiting to enter whenever the doors are opened."

"Many children are killed each year walking railroad tracks to school. Why? They have no roads to walk on. Many children each year have no schools to go to. Why? Hundreds of thousands of children yearly have to do with a little schooling, a little part of a term at school. Why? Because father needs their help on the farm. He isn't making money enough to spare his children's time for school days, because he has to pay so much for hauling his crops to market he has no profit left for extra hired help!

"Isn't it your problem, too, Mrs. Mother? Isn't it worth your while to agitate the question? Isn't it worth your while to bring it up in church, in school, in society, in club, in neighborhood—to talk, to inquire, to agitate, to educate those who don't know and perhaps don't want to know, to understand that the expense of good roads is like the expense of a new threshing machine, plow or a pair of horses, sure to come back many fold in the course of time?"

school beyond the eighth grade, and his life's career is then only begun. He has the years from 28 or possibly 30 to go on earning more money every year than the other fellow can possibly earn.

Young people of Eastern Utah, do you want to earn \$25.00 a month during the winter? Would you like to have \$6000.00 in the bank giving you 5 per cent interest every year?

Look at these figures prepared by Carol D. Wright, in the employ of the United States government.

The average salary of the man who left school when a boy of 14 or younger is from \$600 to \$800 a year.

The average salary reached by the boy who completes his high school course is \$1100 a year.

The average salary of the college graduate is \$2000 a year.

The boy who leaves school at 14 and works till he is 40 years old has worked 26 years and earned \$20,800.

The one that goes on to high school and does not begin work until he is 18, has worked 22 years when he arrives at the age of 40 and has earned \$24,200.

The difference between \$24,200 and \$20,800 is \$3400. This represents the cash received for the four years spent in high school. At nine months to the year this amounts to about \$35 a month for the time actually spent in high school.

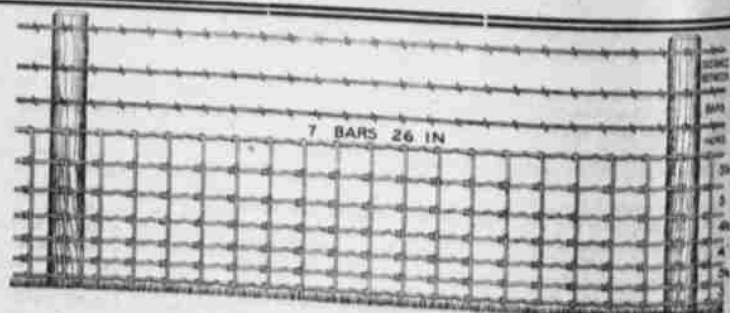
But look from another point of view. The high school graduate earns an average of \$100 a year; the eighth grade graduate an average of \$800 a year. The difference is \$300 a year. Now it would take \$6000 at 5 per cent interest to yield an in can income of \$300 per year.

A high school course is as valuable then from a purely financial standpoint as \$6000 invested at 5 per cent.
