## LARGE APPROPRIATION FOR UTAH INDIANS

RESERVATION WILL PROFIT IMMENSELY FROM FUND.

Money Will Be Used For Improvement of Allotments—Nearly Twelve Hundred Utes Will Participate In Division.

A season of unprecedented activities on Indian reservations in Eastern Utah, under the direction of the government, is promised for 1915, according to A. H. Kneal, superintendent of the Utah and Doray agencies. An extensive program designed to benefit the Indians on the land and prospective white settlers has been mapped out, involving an outlay for various improvements of approximately \$100,000. Industry on the part of the Indians is to be encouraged and liberal allotments as rewards for industrious cultivation of lands and improvements that they will be made as inducements to promote a higher state of efficiency among the natives.

The season's activities will be carried out under supervision of Superintendent Kneal, assisted by W. H. Kneal, of Fort Duchesne, High Commissioner of the Indian Bureau, and George Elliott of Myton, Indian farmer, and William Clark of Garfield, mechanical contractor.

The improvement work is divided into five districts, namely, White Rocks, Fort Duchesne, Myton, Hamden and Alton.

Mr. Kneal predicts a heavy influx of homeseekers in view of the government's liberality. Mr. Kneal gives some interesting data on the Utah lands as follows:

The present improvement fund was created by congressional appropriation on a basis of \$500 per capita, not including the reimbursable fund, which provides for Indians who are willing to improve their own allotment, and amounts to approximately \$100,000. Then, in addition to these sums contemplated in the expenditure already provided for, there will be derived from the sale of sixty-five pieces of land, averaging eighty acres each, about \$52,000, all of which will be expended in development of water and making land improvements.

### 1164 Indians Participate.

There are at present 1164 Indians entitled to a per capita of \$1500 derived originally from the sale of lands purchased by the government from the Indians in Colorado.

To encourage industry among the Indian farmers, the department established the reimbursable fund, which is loaned proportionately to each Indian who has cultivated his allotment, and principally for the purpose of purchasing farm equipment and horses. This loan is required to be paid back by the Indians. Considerable latitude, however, is allowed in the matter of reimbursement.

Great opportunities will be offered to white settlers to lease Indian lands. The reclamation service of the Indian department will extend the irrigation laterals to all Indian allotments, and when this is completed some of the best Indian agricultural lands will be offered for lease on application to the superintendent. Heretofore no money has been allowed lessees, but this is not the case this year, as lessees will be allowed \$5 to \$10 per acre, according to conditions, for cultivation of land and making necessary improvements.

### Five Years' Lease.

The term of lease is for five years, and at the expiration of the lease the lessee has the preference over the highest bidder, who bids for a re-lease, after appraisal of the improved lands. The terms of re-lease give excellent encouragement to the settler.

The lands to be leased include tracts from forty to sixty acres and sometimes even more. The lessee to enjoy all of the land productively, provided in the fourth and fifth years he be required to reimburse the department for the actual money advanced at the outset of cultivation.

The settlers will enjoy many special privileges, such as permission to take timber, loads and other material from the Indian forest reserves. The department often builds houses for the more thrifty settlers, and every consideration is given those who are faithful in their efforts to improve these valuable lands. Generally all privileges granted the Indians are accorded the lessees, as for instance, timber is furnished them at the very lowest cost, and the privilege of grazing is being contemplated as an inducement to stock raising. The sales of the valuable Indian lands, which are sold for the purpose of other allotment improvements and for subsistence that will take place this year, will be held at Fort Duchesne, commencing April 5th and continuing during the season at monthly intervals. These sales will be made to the highest bidder, and sealed bids will be received by the superintendent at any time prior to the commencing of the sale.

Any would-be purchaser or lessee will find the Indian farmers at their service to locate and direct them over the land and explain terms and conditions under which they will accept by lease or purchase these valuable allotments.
