LIGHT AND POWER

Last Wednesday Mr. Brownell, a well known construction engineer, went out to Crane Falls, the site selected for the plant of the Mountain Home Light and Transit Company...

Now that the weather has moderated it is expected that the surveyors will at once run the line for the great power wire between here and the plant site. In a short time the surveyors will also map out a route for a trolley line connecting Mountain Home with Snake river valley.

The company expects to irrigate a large body of Snake river lands, the general manager, (Postmaster Turner) already having received applications for water service from interests representing several thousand acres.

BOND TO HANG

The trial of Wm. H. Hicks Bond (commonly called "Fred" Bond) was concluded last week at Boise. The defendant was charged with the murder of Charles Daly on the morning of Oct. 6, 1904, and, although his attorney, Judge K. I. Perky, made an unusually masterful effort in his behalf, the jury returned a verdict of murder in the first degree. On Saturday Bond was sentenced to hang, April 14 being the date set for execution. Judge Perky filed a motion for a new trial and gave notice of appeal to the Supreme Court. Mrs. Jennie Daly, Bond's accomplice, was placed on trial yesterday.

LEW WALLACE DEAD

Gen. Lew Wallace, author of "Ben Hur," died Wednesday night, Feb. 15, at his home in Crawfordsville, Ind. He was 78 years old.
