younger clergy during the latter part of the reign of Elizabeth, who asserted that Calvinism was inconsistent with the ancient doctrine and constitution of the primitive church, and who claimed a divine right for episcopacy. Bishop Andrewes was the most active leader. The term now generally refers to those who exalt the authority of the church, and attach great value to ecclesiastical dignity and being more or less identified with the ritualistic party.

Q. Which is the largest city in the world, New York or London?

The population of New York City in 1920 was 5,620,048, and of Greater London, 7,258,263. London spreads out over a greater area than New York City. Our American city has an equal if not a greater population than London in the same amount of territory. New Yorkers insist, whether statistics support them or not that New York has the largest population of any city in the world.
