

Death of Well Known Idaho Lawyer.

W. T. Reeves, who was very well known here, died Saturday morning at his home in Pocatello. The Tribune of that place publishes the following with respect to the sad event:

William T. Reeves, one of the best known lawyers of the state, died about 9 o'clock this morning after an illness of more than six months from kidney disease and resultant complications. Death was not unexpected, but the community will feel the loss none the less keenly. *

Mr. Reeves was born at Blandville, Ky., January 21, 1855, and read law and was admitted to the bar at Paducah, Ky. In 1885 he came to Idaho, locating first at Idaho Falls. Later he removed to Blackfoot, then to Boise. From Boise he went to Salmon City and from the latter place came to Pocatello about 10 years ago and resided here since.

Mr. Reeves has always ranked as one of the first lawyers of the state. He has, too, always taken an active interest in politics. In 1890 he was the nominee of the Democratic party for judge of the Fifth district and in 1894 he was nominated as a Populist for attorney general on the fusion Democratic-Populist ticket. In 1897 he was elected mayor of Pocatello on a Citizens' ticket.
