

## Notice of Sheriff's Sale.

Be it known that I, John Olsen, Sheriff of Bear Lake county, Idaho, under and by virtue of an execution, which issued from the District Court of the Fifth Judicial District in and for county and state aforesaid, to me directed and delivered, will on the 26th day of March at the hour of one o'clock p. m. of said day, sell to the highest bidder for cash in hand the following described property, levied upon and attached by me heretofore under and by virtue of an attachment which issued from said court in an action, wherein the Consolidated Wagon & Machine company, a corporation, was plaintiff, and the St. Julien Mining & Smelting company, a corporation, was defendant, to satisfy a judgment rendered in said action in favor of said plaintiff and against said defendant for the sum of Five Hundred Twenty Nine and 29-100 Dollars with interest thereon at the rate of seven per cent per annum from the 2nd day of January A.
