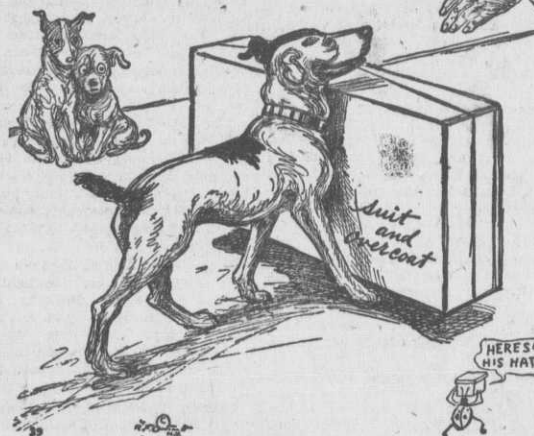

### A SAIL FROM WASHINGTON TO NEW YORK

(Continued from first page.)  
proud distinction of being the oldest inhabited city in the United States. Prior to the coming of the English under Capt. John Smith, it was one of Powhatan's principal villages. The famous Yorktown battlefield is not far from Hampton. The boat just pulled away from wharf at Old Point when the stillness was broken by the report of the morning gun, followed by the clear strains of the Reveille and the Stars and Stripes floated proudly to the top of a tall white mast. At 8 o'clock we landed at Norfolk, a very fine Southern city with a polite and business like population numbering approximately 120,000. I was told that, according to its size, Norfolk does more business than is transacted in the city of New York. However, it does not require much traveling to convince one that the Western cities are far more progressive and up-to-date than those of the East. Upon a comparison of sanitary conditions is the distinction particularly obvious.

At Norfolk I met Mr. Sam Stauffer from the War Department, who informed me that he also was going to New York. Our boat was scheduled to leave port at 7 p. m., and having ten hours of spare time we planned a trip to Virginia Beach, a resort which is noted for its surf bathing. We caught a car at the Monticello hotel, and after 45 minutes ride through cotton, tobacco and sweet potato fields we arrived at the beach, and I looked for the first time in my life upon the Atlantic Ocean. It was not long before we were playing "hide-and-go-seek" among the gigantic breakers with the rest of the merry throng. I was thrown face to face with a man with a fierce black beard and long coarse hair, whom I took for Neptune, but learned later that he was some sort of a German priest. We remained in the water until 4 o'clock and after dressing we sat upon the white sand for an hour listening to the roar of the waves. At 5 p. m. we returned to Norfolk via Cape Henry. The country for many miles south and west of the cape, unlike that through which we traveled on the way to the Beach, is barren and resembles a western desert.
