

# County Fair Premium List

## September 29, 30, October 1st.

The fair grounds will be open for the reception of all articles for one day preceding the opening of the fair. All exhibitors are requested to bring in their exhibits not later than 5 o'clock p. m., on Monday September 28, the first day of the fair. Positively no article will be received after 1 o'clock p. m. Sept. 29.

Single tickets of admission 50 cts. Between the age of 8 and 14 years, 25 cents. Season tickets, \$1.00. Children under 8 years of age, free when accompanied by their parents or guardian.

All persons entering the fair are expected to purchase admission tickets.

On the entry of each article or animal, a card will be furnished to the exhibitor, specifying the class and number of the entry, said card to remain attached to the animal or article during the exhibition, except sheep, poultry and hogs, when it may be attached to the article or pen.

No animal or article will be allowed to compete for more than one premium, nor be entered in more than one class, except as one of a herd or in sweepstakes.

No animal or article shall be withdrawn before 4 p. m., the last day of the fair, unless by special permit of the secretary.

Every animal or article must be entered in the name of the owner or producer, whose number must be endorsed on the entry card, and due record of number and name of exhibitor shall be kept by the superintendent of each class or division.

Exhibitors will at all times give the necessary and personal attention to whatever they have on exhibition, and at the close of the fair take entire charge of the same. The association will use every precaution in its power for the safe preservation of all articles and stock on exhibition, but will not be accountable for loss or damage.

Any exhibitor interfering with the judges during their adjudication, will forfeit their right to premium and all officers are required, and exhibitors are requested to report any violation of this rule to the secretary.

The first premium will be designated by blue cards or ribbon attached to the article or animal; second premium, red. These badges will be placed on the animal or article immediately on making the award.

No article or animal deemed unworthy shall be awarded a premium. But no premium shall be withheld merely because there is no competition. If the article is not worthy of the first premium, it may be awarded the second premium.

Any error in the record of premiums caused by the oversight or neglect, of the superintendent shall be subject to correction in the publication of premiums awarded, whenever proof is furnished the management that a mistake has been made.

**Special Notice**  
All premiums not called for before the first of January next succeeding the exhibition or meeting at which they were awarded will be considered donations to the association.

The association will not be responsible for accidents to live stock or poultry, which may have occurred from any cause whatsoever, but every precaution will be used to prevent accidents of any nature.

**Rules**  
Men in charge of the stock are strictly prohibited from making any remarks regarding the stock unless information be required of them by the judges or superintendent. Persons infringing on this rule will be excluded from the ring by the superintendent.

Any exhibitor placing ribbons on any article or animal shall be required to remove said article or animal from the grounds, and will forfeit all claims to premiums and subject himself to publication.

Exhibitors may have a large lithographed diploma instead of a cash premium, if they so desire.
