The people of this state generally realize that Senator Borah and Senator Brady are working in perfect harmony—one a brilliant lawyer and the other an excellent business man, a combination that has secured results for Idaho in the United States senate for the people of Idaho. Retain this combination by returning James H. Brady to the senate.

Mose Alexander says "that the state of Idaho has gone mad in levying taxes." Well, let's compare Idaho's levy for state purposes with that of a few of the older states, which have long been controlled by the democrats. In Florida the state levy is \$4 a thousand, in Indiana it is \$4.01, in Alabama it is \$3.50, in Maryland it is \$5.10, while in Idaho it is only \$2.11 a thousand. According to these figures the extravagance of Idaho republicans pales into insignificance when compared with that of the Florida democrats.

Elsewhere in this issue is published a fac simile of the ballot which will be handed to you when you go to the polls to vote on Nov. 3rd. Study it carefully so that you will be able to vote intelligently. You will note that the non-partisan Judicial ticket is in the last column on the right hand side of the ballot. There are two candidates for judge of the supreme court, but each voter is to vote but for one candidate. In order not to overlook the judicial ticket, it would be well to vote it first, and while you are voting for supreme judge, don't forget to place a cross after the name of Alfred Budge, candidate for judge of the Fifth judicial ticket. It is true he is sure of election, as he has no opposition, but he is entitled to receive a big vote as an expression of confidence on the part of the people of his district.

Alexander is certainly resorting to cheap political buncombe in his effort to make votes. In his speech at Lewiston he declared that Ator-

ney General Peterson is receiving \$50 a day from the state for the speeches he is making. As the attorney general's salary is only \$4,000 a year, or a little over \$10 a day, we wonder where the other \$39 a day is coming from. If the state committee is paying Peterson anything for speaking in behalf of the republican party, the money comes from the candidates and not out of the state treasury. But suppose Peterson is receiving \$50 a day for campaigning the state, is that any worse than that which Bryan did last year. While receiving a salary of \$12,000 a year as secretary of state, he went about the country, at a time when his presence was needed in Washington, addressing Chautauqua gatherings at \$500 per. He and other members of the cabinet are today making campaign speeches throughout the east in the interests of democracy. Really a man who is seeking the office of governor of a state should endeavor to keep within the bounds of honesty and decency in making charges against candidates of the opposing party.

The candidates on the democratic county ticket are all clean, capable men, but they stand for President Wilson and the policies which he and a democratic congress have foisted upon the people of this nation. Each and every one of them, if in congress, would vote to retain the present tariff law, which has caused such a heavy reduction in the revenues of this country that congress has been called upon to saddle a so-called "war tax" upon the people in order to raise sufficient revenue to meet the expenses of the government. The same condition resulted from the last democratic tariff law, but President Cleveland issued bonds to meet the deficit at that time. The present administration would have been forced to have issued bonds now had it not been for the excuse offered by the European war to levy a "war tax."

As a republican, if you are opposed to the democratic national policies you cannot consistently vote for a democrat for county office, for by so doing you are voting for a man who upholds those principles. We dare say that every one of the democratic candidates who have spoken at meetings in this county, has "lauded President Wilson to the skies" and has expressed his approval of the democratic extravagance in national affairs. Having done this, he then asks you republicans to express your approval of these policies by voting for him. The republican who does this is simply trying to ride two horses at the same time which are going in opposite directions.

Edward A. Walters, Non-partisan Candidate for Supreme Judge

Edward A. Walters, who is a candidate for Justice of the Supreme court, has, during the past eight years, been judge of the Fourth judicial district.
