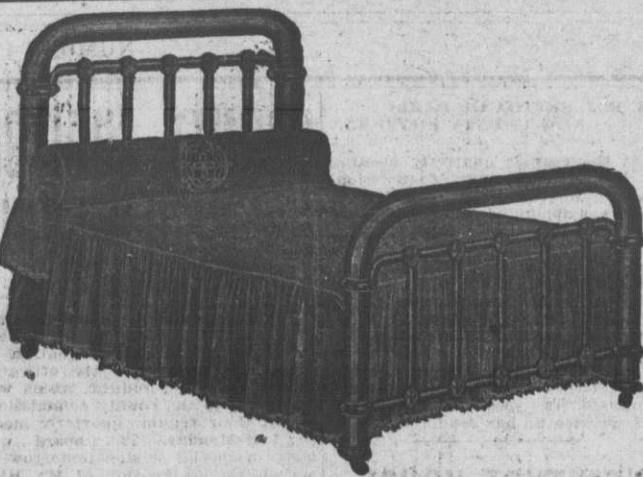

TESTING CATTLE FOR T. B.

Dr. M. Shipley, Federal Veterinary Inspector, who spent some time in the country recently testing cattle for Tuberculosis came in direct response to the request of the Bear Lake County Farm Bureau through the Farm Agent. When Farm Bureau work was revived in January at the request of Brown Bros. and W. E. Poulsen of Liberty and Nelson Bros. of Pogram, who desired to enter their pure bred cattle on the Accredited list as being free from tuberculosis; also in view of the importance of having the milk supply of the county free from contamination by this particular disease germ the Farm Agent immediately took up with Dr. J. A. Adams, State Veterinary, the matter of getting a licensed inspector to come into the county to do the testing. At that time the funds to carry on the work had been exhausted and the new appropriation had not been passed. Correspondence was carried on between the Farm Agent and Dr. Adams which finally resulted in the sending of Dr. Shipley into the county to test particularly the herds listed above. Brown Bros. will enter fifty-two head of pure bred cattle on the accredited list. W. E. Poulsen twenty-three head and Nelson Bros. nine head.

While here Dr. Shipley tested about three hundred head of cattle for T. B. among the number he found five which reacted to the test.

Due to the bad conditions of the road it was not intended that much testing should be done at this time but the Farm Agent has the names of some two hundred Farm Bureau members who want their stock, particularly milk cows tested.

The Farm Bureau has, and is communicating with Dr. Adams to the end that an inspector be detailed in the county in May or June to test every animal for which application is made. In the mean time the names of the above mentioned men, together with any others who may make application will be tabulated and an itinerary made up by the Farm Agent to be used by the Inspector in testing the milk cows of the county and close cooperation between the Inspector and Farm Bureau will be carried out.

T. B. testing is an important phase of Farm Bureau work and will be pushed to the limit by the organization this season. An Inspector

would probably come into the county to test the herd of an individual under certain conditions but all the testing for T. B. that has been done in this county in the past has been done at the instigation of the Bear Lake County Farm Bureau.
