

REPORT OF SCHOOLS

Friday, January 27th, closed the fifth month of the public school work for 1921-1922. Because of the severe cold weather, the snows, and sickness of the past month, the attendance is not up to standard. The report of supt. Faulkner follows:

With the lengthening of the days and the milder weather the parents should make every effort to cooperate with the teachers to reduce tardiness and increase attendance so that there may be greater benefit derived by the children from the efforts of the teachers.

Grade two carried off the honors in having the smallest number of cases of tardiness, the number being but three cases for the entire month.

The high school enrollment is 75 and the per cent of attendance is 94. The Modern Health Crusade is being pushed in most of the rooms. The Knight Bannerets may now receive their pins. The total number who have reached this degree is 46. Parents are urged to visit the schools and freely discuss with the teachers the school problems.

MRS. MATLOCK DIES

This community received a terrible shock Wednesday morning when the news of the death of Mrs. Malcolm Matlock, which occurred during the night, was carried about town. Although she had been in rather poor health for some years, it was not widely known that she was seriously ill and her friends were ill prepared for the sad news of her death, which occurred at the Matlock home on the Clearwater south of the village.

Isabel Urquhart was born in Astoria county, Washington, April 11, 1889. On attaining young womanhood she became a teacher and taught very successfully for seven years in Latah, Nez Perce and Clearwater counties, gaining thereby a wide acquaintance and making firm friends wherever she went.

The deceased is survived by her husband and by her mother; a sister, Mrs. C. W. Groves of Orofino; and a brother, Crete Urquhart, a forest ranger on the Clearwater reserve. The funeral was held last Thursday in the Community church of Kamiah conducted by Rev. Koper of Lewiston, and burial took place at Kamiah—Kamiah Progress.

Can a picture be funny and thrilling at the same time? To the Qualified Electors of School District No. 40, County of Clearwater, State of Idaho.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, According to law and the requisite action of the Board of Trustees of Common School District No. 40, in Clearwater County, Idaho, that a common school bond election of said district will be held at Cottonwood school house, in said district, on Saturday, the 18th day of February, A. D. 1922, between the hours of one o'clock p. m. and five o'clock p. m. at which election there will be submitted to the qualified electors of said district, the following question for their vote and determination thereat:

QUESTION SUBMITTED: Shall the Board of Trustees of Common School District No. 40, in Clearwater County, Idaho, be empowered to issue the negotiable coupon bonds of the district to the amount of not exceeding Six Thousand Dollars, payable on the amortization plan for a period of years not exceeding twenty from the date of issue, and bearing interest at a rate not exceeding 6 per cent per annum; said bond to bear date corresponding to the date of their issuance, for the purpose of furnishing, equipping and building new school buildings, and repairing and improving old buildings and grounds within and for the said district.

Each qualified voter of said district shall vote upon said question by secret and separate ballot, whereon shall be printed, type or other legible writing, the question above submitted, and said ballots shall contain the words, "Bonds, Yes" and the words "Bonds, No," and shall indicate his approval or disapproval of the question submitted by the marking of a cross (X) opposite the group of words on his ballot which expresses his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast upon said question will be opened at the hour of one o'clock p. m. and will remain open until the hour of five o'clock p. m., of the same day, when they shall be closed.
