Dr. H. J. Simmons and wife were in Pocatello Tuesday morning, where the doctor went to consult with Pocatello members of a medical corps, which Blackfoot and Pocatello are trying to raise together. The doctor reports the trip as being very successful and that the organization would be completed at once with twenty-five men from Blackfoot and twenty-five from Pocatello. The medical corps will be a separate unit from the cavalry, and will require no other drilling room, but will attend encampment at San Francisco the same as the cavalry and will be paid regular wages the same as all the rest of Uncle Sams home forces.

Troop B of the 116th cavalry are out rustling recruits to fill up the ranks in order to hold the organization in Blackfoot. Lieutenant Brill and Sergeant Vogt have charge of the enlistment and will be pleased to receive applications.
