QUEEN OF DENMARK EXPRESSES HER ADMIRATION TO SUFFRAGIST LEADER.

The third conference of the international league of women suffragists will meet at Copenhagen the 7th to the 11th. A majority of the delegates, among whom are many Americans, have already arrived and are the guests of leading families in Copenhagen. A brilliant succession of excursions and fetes has been arranged. The queen of Denmark yesterday granted an audience of one hour to Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, of New York, president of the league. The queen showed deep interest in the suffragist movement and regretted that the term of mourning for the late king prevented her entertaining the delegates. She expressed her admiration of American women, saying she thought them active and progressive and that the young women of other countries should take them as their model.

WHAT OF THE NAVY'S MEAT?

INVESTIGATION AT BROOKLYN YARD STARTED BY ADMIRAL COGHLAN.

For the purpose of testing the reports regarding the quality of meat served to the enlisted men at the Brooklyn navy-yard, Rear-Admiral Coghlan, commandant of the yard, has appointed a board of inquiry, with Capt. Stanton of the cruiser Colorado as senior officer. Admiral Coghlan expects that the report will be ready in a day or two. He said yesterday: "There has been a lot of smoke around here and a want to learn if it is caused by the explosion of loaded projectiles or blank cartridges. So I have asked a board of inquiry to look into the matter." There have been rumors that there has been considerable trouble on board the receiving ship Hancock at the yard over the meat and vegetables supplied.

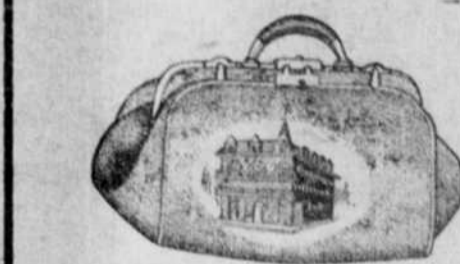
