

OHIO LEGISLATURE ENDS ITS SESSION

MANY IMPORTANT MEASURES ACTED UPON ON LAST DAY.

Columbus, O., April 30.

The Ohio legislature, which had adjourned to adjourn sine die Monday, continued its session until early this morning when adjournment was taken. In the closing hours of the session, the auto license bill, the measure limiting the hours for employment of women, the bill providing for the election of judges, the judicial bill embracing changes in the constitution, and the bill providing for the election of judges, were acted upon.

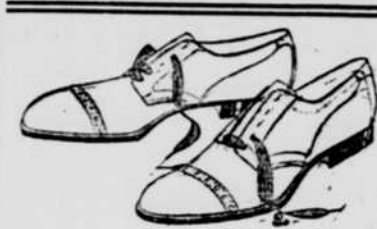

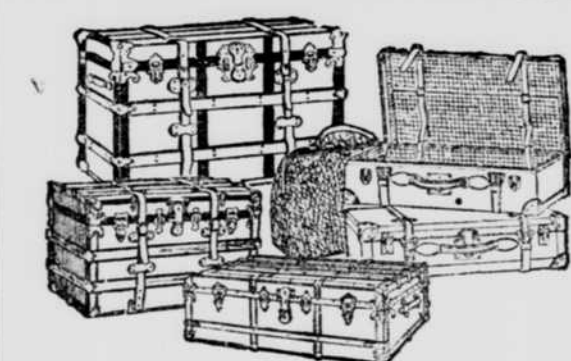
