MANY STEEL PLANTS WILL RESUME SOON

Mills in Parkersburg, Ashland and Newport, Ky., to Start Within Next Month.

Reports received here last night from steel mills at Parkersburg, Ashland and Newport, Ky., were to the effect that the mills there will be operating in full within the next month. The men have decided to accept a reduction in wages.

According to the report received last night, the Parkersburg Iron & Steel Company plant resumed operations in full, the two men employed there having gone back to work. At Ashland, Ky., a committee from the employees went to Parkersburg last Saturday and investigated a report that the men went back to work there. It is understood that the committee returned and recommended that the men accept the reduction and go back to work. As a result, it is said, many of those who went out and refused to accept the reduction have returned to work. This is a big relief and considerable trouble was experienced between the men themselves there.

It is understood that employees of the Andrews Rolling Mill Company at Newport, Ky., have started a motion in circulation securing acceptance of the mill to such a statement that they would return to work at the reduced wage. It is said that as soon as reports can be made to the mill, operations will be resumed.

MAN WHO HUNG JURY EXCUSED FOR TERM

James Miller, one of the jurors summoned for the present term of criminal court, was dismissed from further jury duty for the rest of the term yesterday at noon by Judge A. H. Robinson. After the other eleven men serving as jurors in the case of State of West Virginia vs. Ben G. Galt, charged with striking the five-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. T. B. Smith of Elm Grove, with a whip, had been sworn in, the court, the jury has been in deliberation for three days. Foreman Jack Edick at noon yesterday reported to the court that he had been reached and asked the court to consider an affidavit made by the eleven of the members of the jury. The affidavit declared Miller had persistently voted for acquittal, while the others had voted for conviction.
