STATE SPECIALTY COMMITTEE DECIDES ON REORGANIZATION

TO HELL \$75,000 MORE STOCK—J. C. MAYFIELD CHOSEN HEAD OF NEW FIRM.

Committee Met Saturday Night and Decided on Future.

The committee of ten appointed by the stockholders of the State Specialty company Thursday night, met Saturday night, with the result that it was decided to reorganize the firm.

Among other important business matters taken up by the committee, it was decided to sell \$75,000 worth of additional stock and J. C. Mayfield, a Morgantown business man, was selected to head the new firm.

The capitalization of the State Specialty of the present state of financing the firm stands at \$100,000 per share. With the additional \$75,000 in stock, the company will become a \$175,000 concern. The company has been known as one of the largest concerns in the state and of the past several years has been doing a flourishing business. The present list of stockholders of the company number about 700.

A meeting of the directors and stockholders of the company was held last Thursday night at which time it was decided to reorganize. The firm was reorganized at that meeting a committee which was given full power to act, was appointed. The committee consisted of four directors: J. C. Mayfield, J. W. Schwab, H. W. Thompson and W. J. Bryson, and six stockholders: J. M. Roberts, J. M. Roberts, H. E. Woods, Bert McCreary, A. M. Loran and Miss Myrtle Sheets. This committee met Friday night, but no definite action could be decided upon at this meeting and another meeting was called for Saturday night.

Following the reorganization of the company and business will go on as before, and one of the directors stated yesterday that the company will soon be carrying on a flourishing business as in former years.

BURGLARS MAKE TWO GOOD HAULS SATURDAY NIGHT

WOMEN OF ALBERT FRANCIS AND GEORGE BAUER RIFLED BY THIEVES

New Suit, Two Watches and Two Revolvers Among Articles Taken

Two daring burglaries were staged here early Saturday night, when the homes of Albert Francis and George Bauer were robbed by a thief or thieves.

Both houses are situated on Thompson, and both families were away at the time. Mrs. Francis came home about 10 o'clock, and discovered that the house had been robbed. She at once called the police, and Officer Robert McElmurry went to the house and kept people away so that the tracks about the yard would not be obliterated.

About 12:30 the Francis family arrived and discovered that their home had also been ransacked. The burglars were at once brought from the penitentiary, and a search was started. However, the burglars could pick up no lead, and after about an hour's fruitless hunt were taken back to the pen.

While the search was going on the two families took an inventory of what had been stolen. The Francis family found that two gold watches, two revolvers, a hand saw, several pairs of fine and several other miscellaneous articles had been stolen from them.

Mr. Francis reported that his new suit, valued at \$25, had been taken. Home silverware, a pair of watches, some apples and oranges and a dozen children, which had been in the safe, were also taken from the Francis residence. It was noted at the Francis home that a complete set of ball bearings had been taken from the kitchen.

The silverware had been lying on the kitchen table, covered over by a nightgown. It seemed that the burglars had been in too much of a hurry to make a complete search. The probable total value of the goods taken from the two homes is thought to be about \$750.

After the burglars had been taken to find a clue to the identity of the burglars, a search was made in the neighborhood of the two houses. It was found that entrance had been gained to both places by breaking the catches of the windows.

The local police made a thorough search late Saturday night, working on the theory that the burglaries had been committed by "thieves." It was thought that the houses had been robbed by men of this class due to the fact that so many "rats" had been taken when the thieves could have carried away more valuable articles.

Each place was searched from the windows and doors and would be searched and a search made of the neighborhood for any of these people. The search in itself was a lengthy one and at three places no sign of the burglars was seen. The search was continued for several weeks on several houses at Jones leads to other investigations on the jail house, but no sign of the burglars was seen.

The police believe that the burglaries were committed by a gang of men who were given up.

One Man Arrested

With this arrest the burglary Saturday night investigation has been brought to a close. The man arrested was given a 30-day sentence.
