THE NEW SUGAR MILL

Work Will Begin On the Mill At An Early Date.

President Lindenberg and Consulting Engineer Delbert Are at the Blalack Plantation Preparing to Commence Building.

F. H. Lindenberg, president of the company which is to erect a sugar mill and refinery on the Blalack plantation, is at the home of Mr. Blalack together with consulting Engineer Delbert of New Orleans, going over the plans for the mill. The ground for the mill has been selected and the company is now awaiting the construction of the spur track from the main line to the site of the mill. While there is only a mile of this spur to be laid now, it will be hard to tell to a week when it will be finished; work on the track having been done very slowly up to the present time.

The company is manufacturing the brick for the mill foundation and for the smokestack right on the plantation, about 500,000 having finished. About 1,000,000 bricks will be used.

As soon as the spur track is finished work on the great sugar mill begin in earnest and will be pushed until the work is completed. All the machinery has been ordered and is only awaiting the word from President Lindenberg for it to be placed on the cars and brought to the mill site. For this reason the company is anxious that the railroad company should push work on the spur track from the main line to the mill in order that word may be given the manufacturers to ship all the materials and machinery they are ready to use it at the commencement of the work.

MR. DOHERTY PROMOTED

Will Be Traffic Manager of the St. L. B. & M.

He Will Have Charge of Freight and Passenger Affairs of the Gulf Coast Line—His Promotion Is Welcome by Friends.

It is reported that W. S. Adams has resigned as traffic manager of the St. Louis, Brownsville and Mexico railway, and that William Doherty, who has been general passenger agent of the line since 1904, will become traffic manager, in charge of both freight and passenger affairs. It is said that the official circular formally announcing the change will be issued today, and that the change will become effective October 1.

Mr. Doherty, who will receive a promotion by the proposed change, has had experience in freight as well as passenger matters, and is regarded by railroad men as being well qualified to look after the affairs of the two branches of the traffic business for the Gulf Coast Line.

From the Central, Mr. Doherty went to the Brownsville road in August, 1904, and he has developed the passenger business to a wonderful extent. Along industrial lines, he has done his greatest work, and through his efforts many settlers have been induced to locate along the line of the St. Louis, Brownsville and Mexico.

The man who after October 1st will be traffic manager of the Gulf Coast Line was born January 10, 1864, in Ireland. He was educated in the public schools and at college at Killybegs, Ireland.

His first position in the railroad service was in 1887, as weighing clerk for the Texas Traffic association at Fort Worth, since which time he has been consecutively from 1888 to 1897 with the Gulf, Colorado and Santa Fe railway as clerk in the local freight office, assistant city ticket agent and clerk to general agent, city ticket agent, passenger agent and traveling passenger agent, all at Fort Worth;

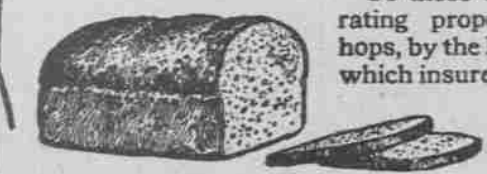

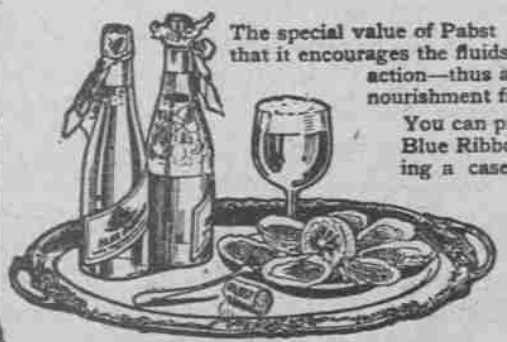
