

## VAN HELPERS' STRIKE TIES UP MOVING

NEW YORK, Oct. 1.—New York faced an unknown situation on annual "moving day," the first under the new anti-profiteering laws.

White city officials estimated not more than 5,000 families would move, there were indications many of these would be unable to take over the apartments promised them because of the present occupants "sitting tight."

**Strike Halts Moving.**

Under the new laws landlords must prove by court action that any rent increase is justified. Eviction suits against a landlord only if the landlord proves he wishes to occupy the apartment himself, that he wishes to raise the building to erect another and that the tenants are disturbed.
