

Stringent Measures in July.

drinking cup in railroad stations, trains, schools and public buildings will be one of the main actions of the state board of public health at their annual meeting in Des Moines July 15. This statement was made by D. A. P. Hanchett, president of the board, and follows the widespread agitation which is being waged throughout the country against this type of drinking vessel. Especially stringent will be the action taken against the railroads which have disregarded the recommendations made in this regard by the board at their meeting last year. At that time, every road which crosses the state was notified to use more care in car sanitation and to provide parafine drinking cups for their patrons. So far as can be learned not a single road has heeded the warn-In many cases sweeping the cars while enroute, a practice which according to physicians, is a most reprehensible one, has been contin-ued unabated.

"The drinking cup is a grave men-ace to health," says Dr. Hanchett. "It is a disseminator of two terrible diseases, which are spreading in spite of every effort that is being made to suppress them. "In the public schools, the drinking cup should go, and should be replaced by the bubbling type of fountain which I regard as the ideal

public drinking vessel.
"At our meeting last year, we recommended to the railroads that they place penny slot machines containing parafine cups in their depots and cars and do away with the public cup. I have traveled over the state during the past year and not in one single instance have I seen that recommendation heeded.

We also object to the sweeping of cars while enroute. This is a particularly loathsome practice. All the filth that is dragged in by the traveling public, is raised in the dust, and inhaled by the passengers. I remonstrated with a porter who was sweeping a car a short time ago, and was referred to the conductor who answered me most impertinently and ordered the porter to continue his

That people who live in Iowa at tain a ripe old age is evidenced by a table of statistics compiled by Secretary Sumner of the state board of The table shows that in the past four months 128 people over 90 years old died in Iowa. They were all residents of the state and for the most part were pioneers in Iowa. The oldest of the 128 was 112 years old when he died. Several reached the ripe old age of 99 and there were many who lived to be 96, 97, or 98 years old. Dubuque county leads the number dying in the last four months at the age of 90 or older. Of the number, the youngest was 90 and the oldest 96.

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
