



FROST MAY COME TONIGHT; WARNING

Local Weather Office Receives Special Warning From Chicago Office Today in This Matter.

LOOK FOR CLEAR NIGHT

If Clouds Lift There is Danger From Jack Frost and People Should Protect Plants and Flowers.

FROST WARNING ISSUED. A special warning against frost tonight, was issued today by the Chicago weather office and wired to Fred Z. Gosewisch, observer in charge of the Keokuk office. The message from the Chicago office was to the effect that if the weather cleared tonight there would probably be frost.

The queen of the May is likely to get chilblains and frost bites yet. She needed a raincoat and rubbers today, more than a sweet smile and a wreath of flowers, and judging from the frost warning being sent from the weather bureau she should take preparedness measures and provide herself with an overcoat or two.

The special frost warning was issued from the Chicago weather bureau and warned all of the stations that if the weather cleared by tonight there was danger of frost. People who have flowers out should take precaution to cover them, and gardeners who have tender plants in the ground should take steps to keep Jack Frost away.

Should the clouds still hang in the sky tonight there is little danger of frost, but clearing weather will bring this unwelcome visitor, the weather office fears.



EXTEND TIME ON CLEAN-UP WEEK

On Account of Cold, Wet Weather Necessitating Furnaces and Stoves, Inspection Trip Has Been Postponed.

TO BE MADE NEXT WEEK

Weather Expected to Clear up and Warm up This Week and Ash Heaps and Garbage Piles Must Go Then.

Clean up week has been extended for another seven days on account of the wet, cold weather, and the necessity for operating furnaces and stoves, with the attendant amount of ashes, has made those in charge of the week here decide to wait a little longer before making a final inspection. When today dawned cold and wet, the officials in charge of the week decided that it would be best to wait a little before finishing up the campaign.

Everyone is expected to get busy on cleaning up their ash piles and garbage heaps and dumping grounds just as soon as the weather warms up and clears up a little. The cold wet weather won't last always, and it will not be granted as a dispensation again, it is likely, unless the week should turn out to be very unseasonable.

The weather may clear up the latter part of the week, and if it does, it probably will clear off warm, so that stoves can be dispensed with, and the ash heaps can be removed. So if you haven't had the ash pile hauled away there will be no excuse for your waiting much longer.

The inspection trip will be made a week later than formerly planned.
