Deadly Chemical Bombs. Hydrocyanic acid, known as prussic

acid, is so poisonous that a mere breath of it means instant death. Sulphuricanhydrid when brought into contact with the air combines rapidly with moisture absorbed from the air, producing sulphuric acid. Thrown in a bomb with just explosive charge enough to disrupt the bomb and scatter the sulphuric-anhydrid, the air for a large space about the explosion would be at once converted into a dense fog of sulphuric acid.
