He proposes a conference of neutral nations, from which shall issue a demand that the war be ended on the follo and terms: The liberation of amail names; the evarustion of all conquered territory; a referendum iu Alsaca Lorrain Finland and Poland to settle form of government and allegiance; freedome of the sear; emancipe-tion of the Jews; gradual dis-armsment and a paymanent court armament and a permanent court of arbitration. Mr. London will seek to have Congress approve this program by resolution.
