COMMERCE OF WORLD

The Imports and Exports This Year Will Aggregate Fully Twentyfive Billion Dollars.

TRADE WILL BE ENORMOUS

Six Times as Much as In 1850 and Two and One-half Times as Much as In 1870,

25 PER CENT OVER YEAR 1900

So Says a Bulletin issued by the Department of Com-merce and Labor.

Washington, May 17.—The world's international commerce will aggregate fully \$25,000,000,000 in the year 1906, says a bulletin issued by the Department of Commerce and Labor.

By the "world's international commerce," the bulletin explains, is meant the imports plus the exports of all countries of the world from which statistical trade reports were available. The

One interesting fact which an examination of the figures of the average monthly trade of the principal countries of the world develops, says the bulletin, is that the United States now stands at the head of the world's great exporting nations. The average monthly exportation from the United States in the nine months ended with March, 1906, is shown by the figures of the Bureau of Statistics at \$147,208973, the monthly average from the United Kingdom for the same period at \$143,674,912, the monthly average from Germany during the 12 months ended with December, 1905, at \$110,777,800 and the monthly average from France for the 12-month period ended with February, 1906, at \$72,370,400. An examination of the import column shows that the United States stands third among the nations as an importer, the monthly average of importation into the United States for the inic months ended with March, 1906 being \$101,506,447, the monthly average into the United Kingdom in the same period being \$241,300,911, the monthly average into the United Kingdom in the same period being \$233,378,333 and the monthly average into Germany during the 12 months ended with Hebruary, 1905, being \$33,378,333 and the monthly average into Germany during the 12 months ended with February, 1906, being \$85,423,550.
