## COTTAGE HILL SCHOOL OPPOSES CONSOLIDATION

SCHOOL BOARD IS PROCEEDING CAUTIOUSLY ALONG LINE LOOKING FOR UNION WHERE POSSIBLE.

At the joint meeting of the patrons of the Cottage Hill school and the school board Tuesday night at the school house, the patrons decided emphatically against the consolidation of their school with the James M. Tate Agricultural School at Gonzalez, and the chairman of the board, Judge E. D. Beggs, stated to a Journal representative that the board will comply with their wishes.

The board looked at a prospective site for a new building for the Cottage Hill school, and will take up the matter of the new building later, Chairman Beggs declared. He stated that the attendance of the patrons at the meeting was large and the discussion very thorough. He people expressed themselves as feeling that they have a most excellent teacher, and that their town will grow.

A very creditable program of entertainment, arranged by the teacher, was rendered just before the discussion, so that the meeting lasted till a late hour. The entire school board, consisting of Chairman Beggs, Superintendent A. S. Edwards, J. H. Pace and L. S. Gilmore, attended the conference.

The board is making an earnest effort to bring about such consolidation as local conditions will permit throughout the country. The result of the Cottage Hill meeting shows what care they are proceeding.
