Civil Term Closes Criminal Monday

The civil term of our Circuit Court (one week) was concluded today.

The last jury case disposed of was that of W. J. Thetford vs. the Y. & M. V. R. Co. for damages in the sum of \$20,000--the Co. being charged with having plaintiff arrested and imprisoned without just cause. The jury promptly rendered a verdict in favor of the Railroad Company. Hill & Witty represented the plaintiff, and Gardner, McFee & Gardner the R. R. Co.

The criminal term will convene here next Monday morning, and the docket contains so many cases that it will require the full three weeks in which to dispose of same.

Dr. W. W. Liddell Died Greenwood Last Night

Dr. W. W. Liddell, one of the most prominent and best known citizens of Carrollton, died in Greenwood last night at the home of his sister, Mrs. J. T. McCain in North Greenwood. He had hosts of friends throughout Le-flore county. He had resided in Carroll county for many years where he was greatly beloved. Dr. Liddell was 62 years old.

A wife, two sons and one daughter survive him, together with his sister here.

The remains were taken to Carrollton this morning and the funeral was held there this afternoon at 1 o'clock at the home. Interment was made in Carrollton.
