Manhattan is sporting its finest mid-winter manner these days. Red-cheeked businessmen hustle from hotels to cabs; youngsters cavort on the Rockefeller Plaza skating rink and Columbus Circle looks more like Newport Harbor during race week than a busy metropolitan intersection.

The Boat Show is in town and, as it does for two weeks every January, the New York Coliseum has become a focal point of attention for the nation's eight million part-time mariners.

Women will be glad to hear the distaff side's desires will be well taken care of by boat manufacturers in 1963. "We have little choice," Ab Crosby of Midwestern Industries in Harlan, Indiana, told me. "It's the woman of the house who makes the final buy-or-no-buy decision for most prospective boat owners."

Crosby's firm produces one of the nation's finest custom made fiberglass boats. From where he sits, he insists, "we have to devote much of our planning to winning the women."

"Naturally," Crosby continues, "colors and comfort are attractive selling points. However, it's important to remember the lady will also be manning the boat's wheel for a summer afternoon's day on the water. For that reason," he points out, "women are becoming as interested in a boat's functioning qualities as are husbands."

In 1963, Crosby told me, power steering will be included on one line of Midwestern Industries' boats. "Our 20-foot models will be jet powered," he said. "The power steering will make it easy for women to handle the controls."

Another functional plus, pitched at women, has been the introduction of hydraulic seats. "Women used to worry about bouncing around in fiberglass boats," he admits. "These new seats make riding as comfortable as watching television in a living room. Again, the development was hurried by concern for the female's comfort."

It's nice to know that boat builders are learning what husbands have long known. The woman is boss.
