You want the admiration of others, don't you? Then, use your head! Dull, dingy hair has a repelling influence on people. You yourself know that you don't turn your head and look a second time at someone whose hair is unkempt, discolored and drab-looking.

Despite the popular saying that "Gentlemen Prefer Blondes" it is my belief that "Gentlemen Prefer Women" no matter what the color of their crowning glory—If it is a color—one color—any color that is attractive.

Look at your hair in the front, on the back of your head, and along several strands, look underneath. Is it streaky and vari-colored, is it curly? Is it lovely because of its well-groomed appearance?

If you are disappointed in the way your hair looks, if the coloring does not suit you, apply an accredited coloring and see for yourself how much improved your appearance will be.

Don't be a stay-at-home, don't lose opportunities for happiness and romance, simply because you may have overlooked the appearance of your hair. It's so much a part of you but that is all the more reason for taking care of it—beautify your hair with regular treatment and a well-rounded diet.

The subject of proper foods for general health, as well as hair health, will be considered in a later column, so for the time being we shall think only about what daily routine will help to develop your hair so that you will be the envy of your friends, and the admiration of your masculine associates.

The small amount of effort expended in brushing your hair daily will pay handsome dividends. Use a strong bristled brush. Divide the hair into small sections (as if you

were going to braid it) all over your head, and taking one part at a time brush upward and outward with vigorous strokes. Keep this up until your scalp fairly tingles with life—you have already improved the circulation, and good circulation to the roots of your hair will result in stronger and healthier hair.

If your hair is dry, try oil treatments or shampoos. Keep out of the sun—on windy days, remember to wear some kind of covering on your head because the elements are hard on hair and render the problem of caring for the hair a most difficult one.

If your hair is oily, use egg shampoos to help brighten it, to bring out the sheen which is ordinarily hidden by the accumulation of oil from the scalp.

It is never good to scratch the head—instead, place your fingertips on your scalp and gently, but firmly, move the scalp backwards and forwards, and from side to side. This exercise has a stimulating effect and will reward you in hair beauty and health.

For the next several weeks, concentrate on your hair. It is a lot more beneficial to follow a few rules for beauty regularly, than to confuse the mind with many which, in the end, are forgotten because it is too hard to remember so much.

Don't go around envying others beautiful hair when it is so easy to have beautiful hair yourself.

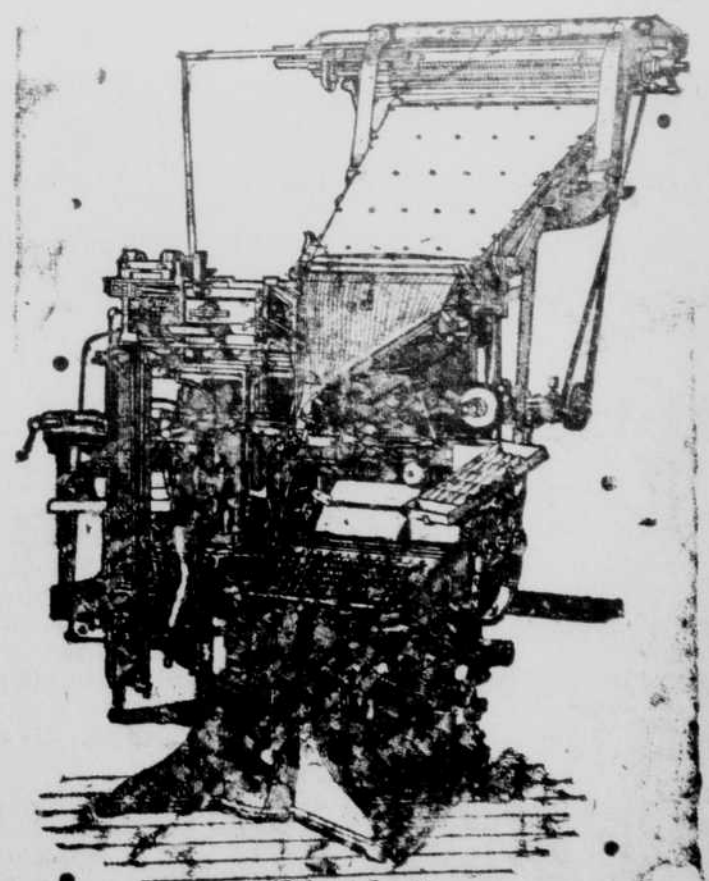
