Mississippi Valley and Ship Island Railroad. We have just received that this road has granted, and laid cross-ties for six miles more of the railroad—making 17 miles from Vicksburg—a gain of the county for a portion of the county bonds reserved to build the road, and that on yesterday Judge Arthur, president of the board of supervisors, with Capt. Raum, another member of the board, and Mr. J. F. Raum, county trustee, went down on the road to examine the work before the county bonds were delivered. They were accompanied by Gen. N. H. Harris, president of the road, and Col. L. A. Campbell and E. Martin, directors of the road, and returned last night, after going over the whole road, which is completed and ready for the iron, within a mile or two of Big Black river. We also learn that arrangements are made for the iron to complete the whole railroad, with timber, pile drivers, etc., to complete the bridge over Big Black river, as soon as the river backs; and then the Port Gibson and Claiborne county citizens can carry it forward to Lee Natheez and Jackson road, and thence to the New Orleans road. The county authorities returned so late last night that we could not learn the result of their personal examination, but we feel assured that the present parties interested in it are determined to put the road through to Claiborne county and onward.

The Vanderbilts seem to be determined to use some of their money for good purposes. They had formerly donated a university. And now we have the following from the Washington Post says: "William H. Vanderbilt has given \$25,000 to the university of Virginia, the gift being the result of General George D. Johnston's recent call upon Mr. Vanderbilt, and a call occasioned with him in relation to Mr. L. J. McCormick's gift of a telescope to the institution. Mr. Vanderbilt's gift makes Mr. McCormick's gift available."
