## BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

Thursday, May 6, 1915.

The claim of J. R. Blake for damages to mare injured by defective culvert on W. P. road was not allowed.

It was ordered that the road commissioners of Beat 1 be directed that in building highways through any incorporated city, town or village within the district that before taking charge of the work that they require such municipality to take care of the grade of all highways and streets; and not to construct any such until having first entered into contract with municipality guaranteeing the commission and this board against any claim for damages that might arise within such municipality for grading in front of or near any abutting land.

The matter of bids for material for filling vats were awarded to J. J. Gill for arsenic in barrels 6 cts. per lb and Sal at \$1.05 per hun. R. K. F. Weir for Pine tar for 31 1-4 cts per gal in 1 gal cans.

The following order was passed relative to the speed of automobile and amended as follows: No person shall operate, run or drive any automobile or other motor vehicle on the public roads at highways of Oktibbeha county, Miss at a greater speed than 20 miles per miles. All other orders are repealed.

The board allowed the commissioners of Dist No. 2 the \$50.00 per year due them.

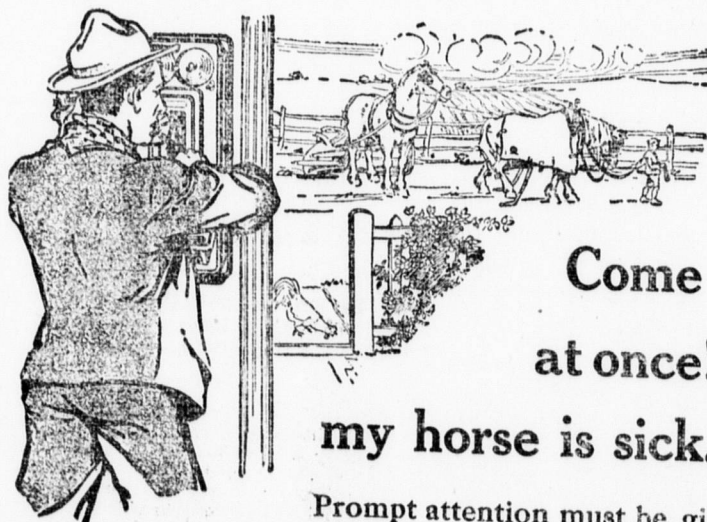
