Notice is hereby given that at the September 1915 meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Oktibbeha County, Mississippi, said Board will create of Beat five, (5) a separate road district under and by virtue of Chapter 174 of the Mississippi laws of 1914, unless in the meantime a petition is filed as provided by Section one, (1) of said Act asking for an election to determine the creation of such road district. That said road district will embrace all of District number five, (5) of said county as before stated, and for further description, it will begin at the Northeast corner of Section thirteen Township eight Range fifteen East, and run thence West to the Northwest corner of Section thirteen Township seventeen Range fourteen East, thence South, to the Southeast corner of Section two, Township seventeen Range fourteen East, thence west to the Northwest corner of Section seven, Township seventeen Range fourteen East, thence South to the Southwest corner of Section thirty-one, Township seventeen Range fourteen East, thence East to the Southeast corner of Section thirty-six, Township seventeen Range fifteen East, thence North to the point of beginning. 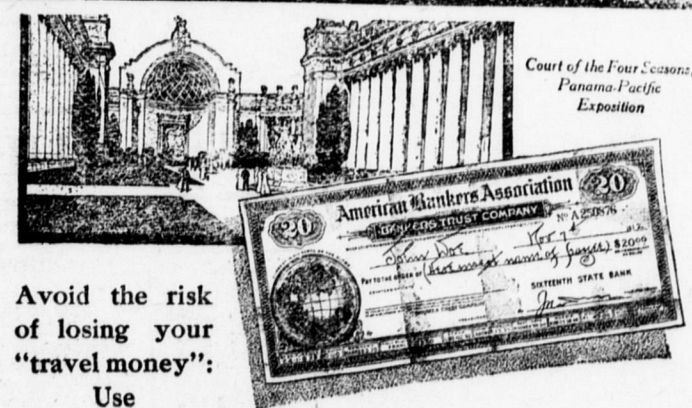
