USR 21 May Come In For Committee Query

A Congressional committee may question the selection of U. S. 21 in Ohio and West Virginia as additions to the interstate highway system.

Sen. Albert Gore (D-Tenn.) charged some states got interstate system mileage they did not request.

Ohio wound up with an unexpectedly large chunk of the additional interstate system mileage allotted Oct. 18. It included about 125 miles of U. S. 21 from Canton to Marietta and extended into West Virginia, connected with the West Virginia Turnpike and went on to Charlotte, N. C.

Although Ohio officials had requested the inclusion on U. S. 21, the official designation came only 11 days after the request was made. (The request was actually made many months ago).

Gore hinted broadly that Commerce Secretary Sinclair Weeks and Bertman Tallamy, public roads administrator, will be called before the Senate Public Works Committee to explain.
