500 OFFICE WORKERS WANTED TO TRAIN FOR \$1600 to \$1800 WAR EFFORT POSITIONS

Tiffin University has bona fide specifications on file for over 500 trained office workers, typists, and stenographers, for preparation for war service positions now open. The specifications are on file subject to examination by any who may be interested.

Due to unprecedented scarcity, and the "Desperate need" as reported, for trained office workers, some war production organizations, as well as other war agencies, are placing prospective office workers in training at this institution, and putting them on their payroll at \$1500 while in training, and at \$1800 to as high as \$1800 as soon as training is completed. They receive free tuition in addition.

These organizations are all in Ohio, and some of them near home. Many of these positions will be permanent after the war for those who merit them. Reasonably rapid promotion is assured.

EARN WHILE YOU LEARN

Compensation at \$125 per month starts the day training begins. Classes now organizing for admissions Monday, October 30. New training Units admitted twice monthly for the duration, including the defeat of Japan. These are war emergency positions, and have to do with the winning of the war.
