

Frankfort, Ky., Dec. 2,-The post-

poned official canvass of Kentucky's ubernatorial vote until Monday has, for the time being at least, cooled the surcharged political atmosphere in a very skeptical manner. It is not like-ly now there will be any developments until the meeting of the election commissioners. Although the candidates for governor are in town, they are keeping quiet, and their friends are emulating their example. There is a deeply settled belief among both Democrats and Republi-cans that the commissioners will not

turn the matter over to the legislature. but will surely issue a certificate to either Gobel or Taylor. If it is given to the former it is possible that the matter may end there, as many of the conservative Republicans are of the opinion that in view of the strong mocratic majority in the legislature it will be practically useless for the Republicans to look for anything in that quarter. If the certificate goes to Taylor it is a certainty that the matter will be taken to the legislature, where Goebel may finally win out.

The Republicans, however, are by no

means a unit in favor of abandoning the fight at the door of the legislature. Some of them are vehement in their as ertions that they will not abandon the fight until there is no possible chance of Taylor being governor of the state. Governor Bradley has evidently made up his mind that somebody will receive a certificate of election, for he was busily engaged all day in packing up his private property in the state house, preparatory to a return to




