There was 17 feet 8 inches on the gauge last evening a fall of 4 inches.

Business was exceedingly quiet about the levee.

There was a light rain early yesterday morning, followed by a cloudy and very warm day.

MISCELLANEOUS.

The James W. Gaff passed down yesterday morning with a fine cargo for Memphis. She made additions of considerable freight here. When we left home on Tuesday, leaving our work in the hands of our friend of the wharf-boat, we did not dream of the "pyrotechnical display" which greeted our eyes yesterday morning. For our friend, Walt, of the Argus, we have a brotherly affection, and it was with feelings of deep sorrow that we read our sub's awful thrusts at the innocent and harmless lamb. When we next leave town, we will give our substitute proper instructions as to Walt and his little Argus. The Champion made a good trip of it from Cairo to Metropolis and return. She left this port at 1 o'clock Wednesday morning to bring the Robinson circus company to this place, and arrived here at nine o'clock yesterday morning. The DeMet passed up for Paducah at 2 p.m. with a good trip of freight and people. Among her passengers was Miss Sallie Cutting, of Metropolis, who has been visiting friends in St. Louis for the past few weeks. The Grand Tower passed down late Tuesday night with a good trip for Vicksburg. The Belle Memphis, due up last evening, had not arrived at dark. The Golden Crown is due from Cincinnati, for New Orleans. She will probably be in port this morning. The Belle of Shreveport arrived from New Orleans last evening, and after discharging a small lot of freight here departed for St. Louis, for which port she has about 800 tons sugar and molasses. Leo Crane, who has been sick and confined to his bed for several days, was said to be in a critical condition yesterday. Mr. Fitzgerald, clerk of the Belle of Shreveport stopped off of the boat here and left for his home in St. Louis, by rail, last evening. Wharf-master Duke Enninger, is up and able to be about again. The temperance folks are negotiating with the Champion for their big excursion to take place soon. The next trip south of the Belle of Shreveport will be her last for some time, as she goes on the docks on her return, to receive a complete over-hauling. Mr. George Baker, clerk of the DeMet, stopped over in Cairo yesterday while his boat went to and returned from Paducah. We dare say his visit was not an unpleasant one.
