

LATEST BY TELEGRAPH.

DR. TANNER.

NEWYORK, Aug. 1. - At noon to-day Dr. Tanner enteres on the thirty-fifth day of his fast. He slept well the night previous and appeared refreshed this morning. He kept to the gallery all day, and was attacked with nausea and vomitting at different periods, throwing up a mixture of bile and mucus. A 2:45 his pulse was found to be 78; his temperature 98.4 and the dynamometer marked 82 kilometers. At 2:55 he got up to put on his clothes but could not do so as he had an attack of vomitting, At 7:35 and 8:40 this evening he had attacks of vomitting and at 9 p. m. retired to his cot and appeared to be sleeping. His medical attendants said he was in a feebler condition than yesterday; that attacks of nausea were unfavorable, and as they occurred after drinking a small quantity of fluid, it showed the doctor's stomach to be in a highly irritated condition. One of the medical men said Dr. Tanner was failing every day, but there was no doubt he would finish his self-imposed task. He thought the frequent attacks of vomiting showed that the coats of the stomach were somewhat inflamed. Dr. Tanner took nothing to-day but a little carbonated ice water.
