The \$1 hunters' license, says the Baton Rouge correspondent to the Picayune, is going to be even a bigger revenue getter for the State than the law-makers themselves anticipated, and will probably bring into the State \$75,000 for this year. Already the State Auditor has sent out 41,000 \$1 hunters' licenses to the Sheriffs of the different parishes, and the quail season—the real hunting season in Louisiana—has not begun, and will not open until the first of November. When the quail season does begin the demand for the hunting licenses will be materially increased, and it is likely that 75,000 will be sold in Louisiana before the season is ended. In addition to the \$1 State license, the Auditor's Office has sent out four or five hundred \$25 non-resident licenses, and the sale of these to hunters from other States will materially increase the revenue from this source.

Sheriff Hughes has issued 450 \$1 hunters' licenses to date, but has not received a single application for non-resident license.
