## A Shocking Tragedy.

The New Orleans newspapers of Thursday contained the details of the tragic and shocking death of Mr. Edgar H. Farrar, Jr., of that city, which will be read by Tensas people with pain on account of the young man's connection with this parish, where his father was born and where his grandfather lived for many years and died.

Young Mr. Farrar's death came at the hands of a burglar, who robbed his residence in New Orleans, and being pursued by his victim, turned and fired one shot, which proved fatal.

Edgar H. Farrar, Jr., was the oldest son of Mr. Edgar H. Farrar, who is the most eminent lawyer in Louisiana and one of the most distinguished lawyers and publicists in America. The grandfather of the unfortunate young man was Mr. Thos. P. Farrar, long one of our most prominent citizens.

Young Mr. Farrar after receiving a collegiate education at the University of the South and the University of Virginia, was admitted to his father's law firm and gave promise of a brilliant career. He was of a bright, sunny temperament and had hosts of friends. He was married only a few months to Miss Searing of New Orleans and his girl-bride survives him.
