## "THE NEBRASKA" IS TROPHY SHIP OF THE ATLANTIC FLEET

WILL WIN THE \$50,000 PRIZE OFFERED BY GOVERNMENT ON WORLD TOUR.

Homeward bound, a long way 'round, But we'll be found, safe and sound On home ground. On time.

And say! By the way, Won't it be gay? Hoo-ray!! For the U. S. A!!! and HOME. —From The Antelope.

And when on Sunday, the 21st of February, when the great Atlantic fleet arrives in New York harbor, after making the greatest cruise ever made in the history of the world by a battleship fleet, there will be one among the many that will be heralded far and wide as the Trophy Ship, and that is the Nebraska, built in Seattle by Moran Bros., and it WILL be the TROPHY SHIP in every respect, for there has not been one contest in which its men have been entered that it has lost and there are records to show that many and many of the contests were mighty hard ones.

### Are Real Sports.

Baseball, football, rowing, wrestling, boxing and in fact every sport that the sailor lads have indulged in have been won by the Nebraska. But greatest among all other honors which Fate and perhaps also the God of War, Mars, has bestowed on this Seattle-made fighter is the wonderful world-record-breaking target practice scores which made not only the men of the fleet but the "big ones" at HOME and in fact the entire world sit up with big eyes and take notice.

And another honor that comes close to the target practice achievement is the \$50,000 award that will in all probability be made the engineers and firemen of the Nebraska by Uncle Sam for burning less fuel than any other ship in the fleet on this wonderful cruise. The fleet arrived at Gibraltar yesterday, and the Nebraska has up to this time won by an overwhelming margin. Two years ago, when the Nebraska went into commission, it was known as a Rookie Ship. This is a contemptuous phrase applied to a new boat manned by inexperienced sailors.

"The Trophy Ship." One year ago, the men on the other ships preferred to forget the name as attached to the Nebraska. They called it the Star Ship and, quoting again from The Antelope, the monthly magazine published aboard the Nebraska, "It is noticeable that we haven't heard much

about the 'Rookie Battleship' of late."

Today the Nebraska is the Trophy Ship and she WILL REMAIN the Trophy Ship, for there is not a man on board who does not say "I WILL WIN."

In just a few days the ships will steam into Hampton Roads, and President Roosevelt, the chief executive of the United States, whose very name calls for three hearty and sincere cheers and a "Tiger" on board the Nebraska, will review the fleet. Proudest among them all, the one carrying the happiest men in the world, will be our own, the Nebraska. SHAM PAYNE.

DEAFENING CRASHES CLOSE SYMPHONY MASTERPIECE.

PITTSBURG, Pa., Feb. 5.—Emil Paur, director of the famous Pittsburgh orchestra, has at last produced his long-awaited symphony. Critics the country over call it a masterpiece. It is called "In der Natur," and purports to be a musical representation of sounds and impressions received by the composer in the forests of his fatherland, near the Alps.

The closing movements of the symphony are distinguished by some deafening crashes of sound, that fairly shake the building.

To produce the effect he wanted, Director Paur found that with every man in the orchestra working his hardest, the volume of sound was not great enough. So he invented a contrivance by means of which he merely pushed little buttons on his music stand, as he was conducting, and thus, by electricity, the great Carnegie pipe organ in Carnegie music hall pealed out its deafening notes, producing an effect that was truly startling.

## EXTRAVAGANCE IS CHARGED

WASHINGTON, Feb. 5.—By U. P. —The forest service got its usual annual drubbing today, the criticism against it coming principally from Mr. Smith of California, Mr. Cook of Colorado and Mr. Mondell of Wyoming, all of whom charged extravagance in administration and the extortion of money from miners, farmers and even the owners of beehives. Mr. Cook attributed to Mr. Pinchot, the chief forester, the ulterior motive of scheming for Secretary Wilson's seat in the cabinet. Both Mr. Pinchot and the forest service were vigorously defended by Messrs. Mann of Illinois and Weeks of Massachusetts. All attempts to amend the bill in any important particular failed.

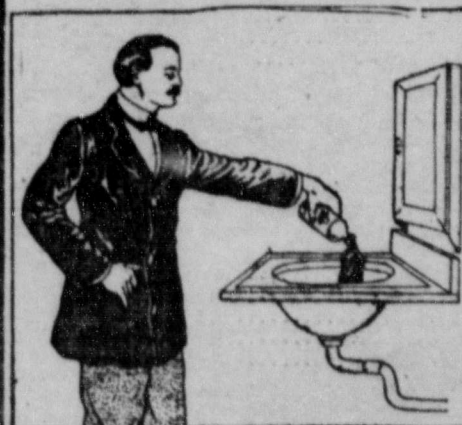
