WASHINGTON, Dec. 5,-The U. S. forestry service feels a natural taking to keep fires out of the great Olympic peningula the past year and now that copious rains have fallen, a great sigh of relief has gone up from headquarters.

On January 29 last a great tornade swept thru the Olympic peninsula Northwestern Washington, destroying approximately 6,000,000, 000 feet of standing timber over an area of 1,000 square miles, thus constituting the greatest fire trap in

Special patrol forces were increased to 46 men and these made two round trips daily in the lower country and one in the higher regions.
