All Gestapo Agents Should Be Expelled— Dagens Nyheter

STOCKHOLM, Dec. 5 (By wireless)—Commenting on the expulsion of Hans Metzger, a Secretary of the German Legation in Stockholm, who had tried to recruit Swedish volunteers for Germany, *Dagens Nyheter* demands in an editorial that the staff of the German Legation be reduced, it urges that all employees with established Gestapo connections and similar affiliations be sent home, since otherwise there is a risk that they go underground and try to "hibernate" in Sweden. After Germany's refusal of Swedish aid to the population in northern Norway, the time has come to reconsider seriously Sweden's relations with Germany on all essential points, the editorial concludes. Other papers express amazement that the Germans actually believed it would be possible to recruit Swedes to fight against Norwegians.

Magnuson Attends Inaugural Of Congressional Teammate



Present in Olympia to pay personal and official respects to his friend and confidant of long-standing upon the latter's inauguration as Governor of the State of Washington, was Warren G. Magnuson, elevated last November to the U. S. Senate from the position he has occupied over a period of years in the Lower House, who crossed the continent to pay honor to the new Governor.

Before his election to the Senate four years ago, Governor Mon C. Wallgren served with Mr. Magnuson as a fellow member of Washington's congressional delegation. During this association, the two formed a close attachment which was broadened and made even more effective when Mr. Wallgren advanced to the Upper House.

The two men made an unbeatable combination in furthering the interests of their state and increasing its influence in shaping

Now, with Mr. Wallgren installed as Governor and Mr. Magnuson seated as a member of the body


which the former dignified for the last four years, the two men are in an even more favorable position for teamwork on behalf of the state.

No one doubts they will maintain in their new spheres, the reputation for statesmanship of a high order which they have already established in their political activities in the past.




