Pure Food Law.

The first arrest for violation of the pure food law was made at Larimore. A warrant was issued on complaint of E. F. Ladd the state chemist, for the arrest of L. N. Clark, who lives at Larimore, and represents a grocery supply house doing business at Chicago.

The firm represented by Mr. Clark has shipped at least three carloads of goods to Larimore and other points in that section of the state. Wednesday Prof. Ladd visited Larimore and made a demand on a Mr. Wallace, who brought the car from Chicago, for a five gallon keg of cider vinegar, and proceed to analyze it. The analysis showed that the vinegar was not cider vinegar but an adulteration, and the warrant for the arrest of Mr. Clark, who sold the goods, was issued yesterday morning and sent to a deputy sheriff at Larimore for services.

The firm represented by Mr. Clark is believed by Mr. Ladd to be one of 27 Chicago concerns who have formed a combination for the avowed purpose of fighting the pure food laws of North and South Dakota and Minnesota. Mr. Wallace and Mr. Clark both stated to Prof. Ladd, when he made the purchase of vinegar that the firm would fight the case and they also informed him that he ought to have got hold of some of the goods shipped in the two former cars if he wanted to get the adulterations. In this particular car it was claimed that adulterated foods had been culled out. Owing to the fact that this is the first arrest under the new pure food bill much interest will attach to the prosecution of the North Dakota representative of the firms who have been selling direct to the farmers and consumers. State's Attorney Wine-man will conduct the prosecution Grand Forks Herald.

Burial Permits.

Permit signed by attending physician or coroner required before burial of body of any human being.

Section 269 of the Revised Codes reads as follows: "No undertaker or other person shall bury or prepare for burial the body of any human being without a certificate signed by the attending physician or by the coroner." This is the law of the state on this subject and will be rigidly enforced. All persons are bound by it and no person or society of persons is exempt from the operation of the law.

The state law requires that a permit, signed by a physician or coroner, shall be secured before any human body can be buried. This law has never been enforced in this county, but we are informed that it will be from now on. We believe that enforcement of this law is for the general welfare.

This is clear and concise. If a permit cannot be signed by a physician for the reason that there was no attending physician, then, in every case, it must be signed by the coroner. Any person neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of the above section is guilty of a misdemeanor.

Special Session of the Legislature.

Governor White will call a special session of the legislature in September to take action in the emergency caused by the failure of the institution bonds to be negotiated. The session will be a short one, probably not more than three or four days. The governor leaves tomorrow on a trip through the state, and will visit the different institutions and ascertain what amounts they will need for essential improvements and to defray expenses already incurred, and he will also endeavor to bring the institutions to an agreement as to what they shall receive, so that there will be no friction when the session is called. The governor believes this to be the only way out of the emergency. Wednesday noon he stated to the Tribune that there would be \$100,000 available from the general fund, above current expenses to the end of the year. This amount could be appropriated directly to the institutions, and \$150,000 more could be appropriated available in March next. This would give the institutions a basis of credit, and would enable them to meet the existing conditions. The expense of a three or four day session of the legislature would not exceed \$10,000, and the business necessary could be disposed of in that time.--Bismarck Tribune.
