MODERN WAREHOUSES IN NORTHERN STATES

> Give Onions as Little Artificial Heat as Possible.

Provision Should Be Made for Ample Ventilation to Throw Off Moisture -Dry Cellar Will Give Satisfactory Results.

In the northern states onion warehouses should be built with the purpose in mind of keeping the temperature just above 32 degrees Fahrenheit during severe winter weather with as little artificial heating as appear. Provision is necessary ing season. for ample ventilation, since the bulbs are continually giving off moisture which must be removed. This can be increased materially on clear days by opening doors and windows for a few hours. In very cold weather it is necessary to heat the house during this process, in order to prevent the freezing of bulbs. A steam or hotwater heating system or stoves placed at intervals is satisfactory. Large bulbs are stored in slatted bushel boxes or folding crates, while bottom sets should be placed two to four inches deep in shallow crates;

Where a modern warehouse is not available a dry cellar which can be held at 32 to 35 degrees Fahrenheit can be used with good results.

HOW TO PLANT POTATO SEED


