

COMPENSATION LAW INCLUDES PUBLICSCHOOLS

Attorney General Holds Districts Must Insure With State Fund Unless Application Denied.

Ruling Given to Commissioner of Education—If Turned Down Districts Furnish a Surety Bond or Guaranty Contract.

School districts in Idaho come within the purview of the workmen's compensation act and districts must insure with the state insurance fund, if their application for insurance therein is denied they may furnish a surety bond or guaranty contract. Attorney General T. A. Walters so holds in an opinion given to Dr. E. A. Bryan, state commissioner of education.

In quoting section two of the act showing that school districts are included within the jurisdiction the attorney general drops a number of other classifications and as these include other

districts the section is quoted in full as follows:

SECTION IN FULL.
Sec. 2. This act shall apply to employees of the state and of all counties, cities, towns, villages, school districts, irrigation districts, drainage districts, highway districts, road districts and other public and municipal corporations within the state; but not to public officials who are elected by popular vote or who receive salaries exceeding \$2400 a year. Policemen and firemen and others entitled to pensions shall be deemed employees within the meaning of this act. If, however, any policeman or fireman or other person entitled to a pension claims compensation under this act there shall be deducted from such compensation any sum which such policeman or fireman or other person may be entitled to receive from any pension or other benefit fund to which the state or municipal body may contribute.

In his letter and opinion to the state commissioner of education, Attorney General Walters says:

"The question has arisen in numerous instances as to whether or not the workmen's compensation act includes within its purview school districts, and if so, whether such school districts must insure with the state insurance fund or have the option to submit a surety bond or guaranty contract."

WHAT LAW SAYS.
"This act shall apply to employees of school districts, and other public and municipal corporations within the state." (1917 laws 255, sec. 2.)

"A public corporation may insure against its liability for compensation with the state insurance fund and not with any other insurance carrier unless such fund shall refuse to accept the risk when the application for insurance is made." (1917 laws 255, sec. 107.)

CONCLUSIONS REACHED.
"From the foregoing provisions it appears that:

"1. School districts are within the purview of the act; and,
"2. That such districts must insure with the state insurance fund unless their application for insurance therein is denied, in which last instance, only, may school districts furnish a surety bond or guaranty contract."
