New York, Nov. 9.—Club owners who
expect to put over the new league of
American Association and International
league clubs do not expect to get
through without trouble from the clubs
which will be left out. In fact, according
to statements made today to the
United Press plans already have
been discussed looking to a settlement
of this controversy before it arises.

However, regardless of legal actions
or appeals to the National commission,
the eight club owners are determined
to carry the matter to a conclusion.
The National commission, it is understood
here, has already consulted with
regard to the proposition and is expected
to give its sanction.
