Captain Carithers Assigned RUSH STILL ON AT Will Act on Advisory Boards to Remove Doubt.

State Divided Into 12 Distate Divided Into 12 Districts in Which 41 Counties Are Grouped and New System in Draft.

Under authority vested in him by the president, Captain W. H. Carithers, medical reserve corps of the army, designated as an aide to the governor and assigned the state of Idaho as medical supervisor, has divided the state into 12 districts for each of which he has, named medical boards which are authorized to take up medical examining work when the second draft goes into effect. Some of the most eminent physicians in the United States have been named to take charge of the work in the various states. To Washington, Dr. James R. Yocum has been assigned; to Utah, Dr. William Brown Ewing, Salt Lake; Montana, Dr. Thomas Casey Witherspoon, Butte, and Oregon, Dr. Kenneth Alexander J. MacKenzie. Captain Carithers is making Boise his head-quarters. All told he has appointed 64 physicians and dentists to act in idaho.

A NEW SYSTEM.

The new selective service regulations provide for the erecting in every state a number of medical advisory boards so located as to be easily accessible to every local board. Every governor has been given supervision of the organization of the medical advisory boards, including the number and location of such boards in his state, and upon his recommendation members of the medical advisory boards are appointed by the president. In order to assist the governor in organizing such boards an officer of the medical reserve corps has been assigned as medical aid to him. This is the position that Captain Carithers holds.

The purpose of the medical advisory The purpose of the medical advisory boards is to provide for the re-examination of registrants by competent men, specialists in various lines, to whom local boards may refer all doubtful cases as to physical qualification. It is believed that by adopting this new plan there will be a very much smaller percentage of rejections after the men drafted reach cantonment camps.
