The newspapers have recently chronicled the fact that an Indiana dairyman was found by the state inspectors to be selling dirty milk. The officers purchased some of this milk for the purpose of securing evidence against the dairyman. They found the dirt and the dairyman was prosecuted for selling a filthy product. The Journal of the American Medical Association reports this decision in a recent issue and says that it refrains from commenting on this example of judicial wisdom for fear of violating the postal laws.
