The total tax levy for Rathdrum for all purposes—state, county, school and municipal—is 51 mills. This means that \$5.10 taxes must be paid on each \$100 of taxable valuation, or \$51 on each \$1000. Two or three other places in the county have higher levies. It must be remembered that the greater part of this is local and the increase over last year amounting to ten mills is entirely local. The combined county and state levy is the same as last year. The state levy, itself, is lower, but the county levy is correspondingly higher to meet the needs of the schools. The state levy could have been one-third less if the highway tax had been eliminated. Governor Davis, in his speeches defending the cabinet system of state government as efficient and economical, is reminding the voters that the state levy is lower this year. He is also pointing out that Illinois, which has the cabinet form of government, was the only state to show a reduced levy last year. So much for the cabinet system, but it is well in the interest of fairness that the voter should know that the tax increase this year cannot be charged to the state board.

The big political fight in Idaho is between Gooding and Nugent for the U. S. senate, and the main issues are the league of nations and the tariff. Gooding, the republican candidate, opposes the league and favors a protective tariff.

ONLY seventeen days remain before election. There are but fifteen days left in which to register. However, those who registered for the August primaries need not register again for the November election.

The ballot is the one instrument by which every citizen can have a voice in his or her government. It is a powerful instrument and should be used intelligently and to good purpose.
