PORTLAND, Ore.—A tearing gale,
accompanied by heavy rain, was
pounding the coast line of Oregon and
Washington Saturday.

Unfilled Steel Orders Less.
NEW YORK.—The monthly tonnage
report of the United States Steel cor-
poration shows 9,021,481 tons of un-
filled orders on hand November 30.
This is a decrease of \$15,371 tons from
last month's unfilled orders, which
totaled 9,836,852 tons.

WASHINGTON.—The military situ-
ation in Haiti and Santo Domingo,
from the point of view of the marine
corps, is "extremely satisfactory,"
Major General Lejeune, commandant
of the corps, declares in his annual
report to the secretary of the navy.

DECLARES IRELAND IN STATE OF WAR

**CORK IS PUT TO TORCH FOL-
LOWING AMBUSH OF
SOLDIERS.**

ONLY ONE FATALITY REPORTED

City Hall, Library and Corn Exchange
Among Buildings Burned by
Firebugs—One Killed,
Eleven Wounded.

DUBLIN.—Several large sections of
Cork were devastated by fire Satur-
day night and Sunday. The conflag-
ration followed the shooting from am-
bush of a military party Saturday.

On the south bank of the river Lee
the city hall, Carnegie library, the
Corn Exchange and other buildings
were razed by the fire, while in the
territory between the northern and
southern branches of the river much
havoc was wrought by flames in the
business section, constituting the cost-
liest destruction of property since the
reprisals began in Ireland.

The damage done by the flames is
estimated at between 2,000,000 and 3,-
000,000 pounds sterling.

It was reported from Cork Sunday
that the newly arrived parties of aux-
iliary cadets marched through the
streets holding up and searching pe-
destrians and firing into the air, fol-
lowing the ambush of auxiliaries with-
in half a mile of the barracks, 12 of
them being wounded by a bomb
thrown from a lorry.

Between 7 and 8 o'clock a period of
intense quiet fell on the city, but
near 9 o'clock uniformed men began
to display great activity in parts of
Cork.

Passengers Beaten Up.

At some points tram cars were held
up and passengers taken out. It was
reported that a number were beaten
and others placed against the wall
and closely questioned, but were
finally allowed to proceed.

In the Summer Hill district, the
scene of the ambush, shortly after
curfew two brothers, named Delaney,
are reported to have been taken from
their homes and shot, one subse-
quently dying.

During the hour before curfew ter-
rorism held sway and when the
streets were emptied of civilians loud
explosions and rifle and revolver
shots kept up until early morning.

Fear Lives Lost in Fires.

It is not improbable that lives have
been lost in the fires. Already sev-
eral persons connected with the de-
stroyed houses an dbusiness premises
are reported missing.

Only one large drapery establish-
ment is left intact in Cork.

Proclamation of War.

A proclamation declaring that "the
public must at once realize that Ire-
land is in a state of war with forces
of the British crown" has been is-
sued over the signature of the of-
ficer commanding troops of the Irish
republican army at County Mon-
aghan.
