General News Brevities.

Harland F. Stone of New York was appointed April 2 by President Coolidge to succeed H. M. Daugherty as attorney general.

Severe windstorms in the central states last Friday and Saturday caused the death of a dozen persons, the injury of hundreds and a heavy property loss.

Cancellation of contracts for export to Japan, caused by the financial stringency in the island empire, has brought sharp reaction to the lumber industry in Oregon and Washington.

An adjusted pension bill by Bursum for war veterans was passed by the U. S. senate April 1. It is estimated to cost an additional 55 million dollars the first year.

Figures just made public by the census bureau give the wealth of the United States, Dec. 31, 1922, at 320 billion dollars. The assessed valuation of property, however, was only 155 billions.

Attorney General H. M. Daugherty resigned from the cabinet March 28 at the request of President Coolidge. In asking for the resignation, the president stated that Mr. Daugherty could not give him disinterested advice while defending himself in the senate investigation.

Oregon's compulsory public

school law was declared unconstitutional by the federal court at Portland last Monday. Private and parochial schools attacked the law. Governor Pierce declared the case would be appealed to the U. S. supreme court.

Declaring that "wanton waste of virgin timber has forced lumber prices so high that a 40 per cent curtailment in consumption has been brought about," Secretary Wallace before the house agriculture committee urged strict supervision of forests by the U. S. government. Mr. Wallace indorsed the Clarke bill for an annual appropriation of \$2,700,000 for forestry supervision. Approximately 10,000,000 acres of timber are cut yearly, he said, and only 1,000,000 acres are utilized for agricultural purposes.

Notice is hereby given, that the Annual School Meeting of Common School District No. 47, County of Kootenai, State of Idaho, will be held on Saturday, the 19th day of April, 1924, at One o'clock P. M. of said day at the Corbin School House in said district, and continue in session until business is disposed of. From 1 P. M. until 4 P. M.

That at said meeting the following officers of the school district will be elected:

I. A trustee to serve for a term of three (3) years.

II. A trustee to fill out the unexpired term of Trustee James Dillon.

That at said meeting an election will be held to determine whether or not a special tax shall be levied not to exceed ten (10) mills on each dollar of the taxable property of said district, and having determined that a special tax shall be levied, election will then be held to determine the amount of money to be raised by such special tax; also, to decide what to do about the Corbin school site, vote money, and locate new site if deemed necessary.

That at said meeting an election will be held to determine the length of time school shall be taught in said district for the ensuing year and the seasons of the year in which the same shall be taught.

That at said meeting any other business pertaining to schools and school interests will be transacted.

That all elections at said meeting will be by ballot.

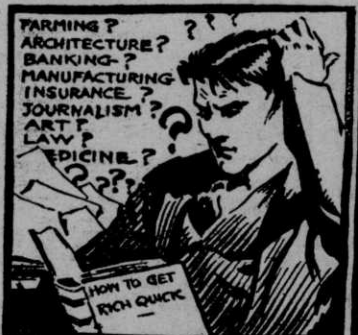
